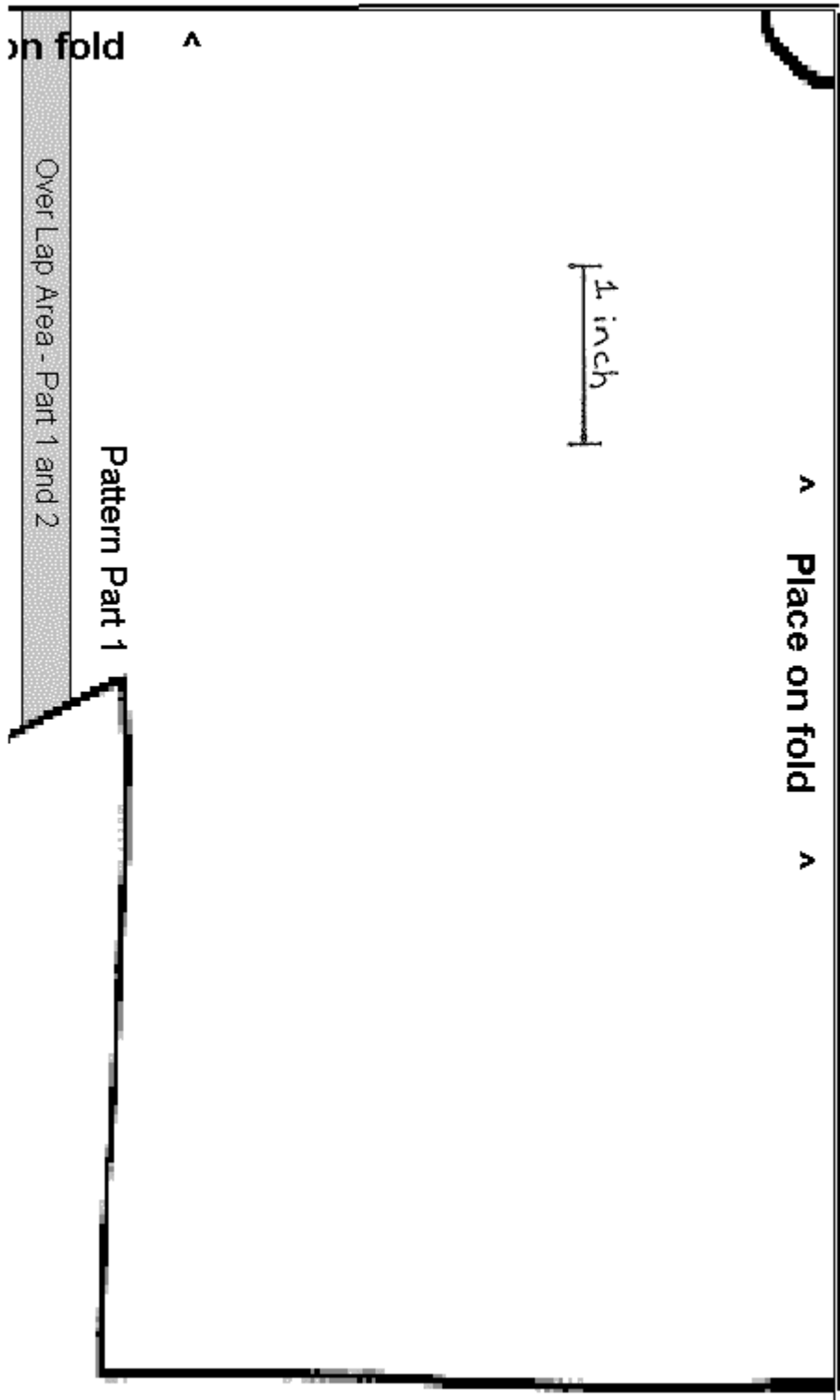

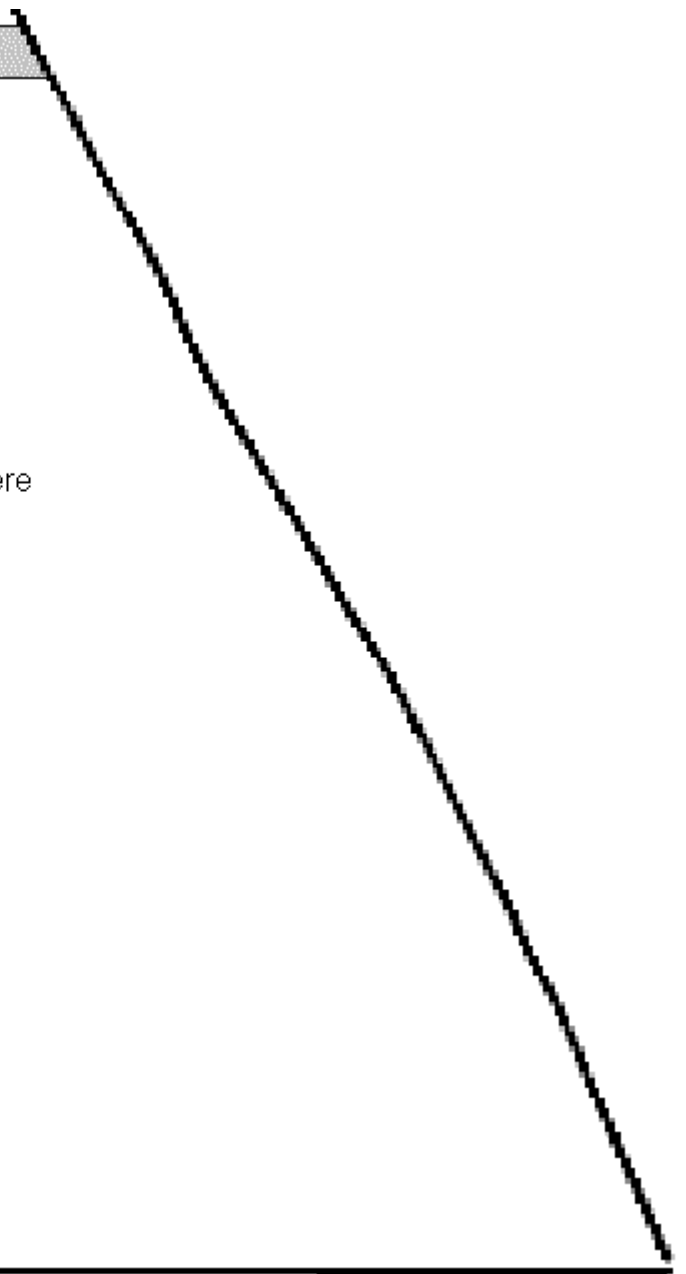


### Pattern Part 2

Following directions on pattern cut from Polar Fleece. Sew side and underarm seams. Turn and slip over head. Gather sleeve edges at wrists, gather neck edge to fit and gather bottom edge to fit the bottom of the stump. Using a very long needle and very strong thread determine where crotch should be and hand stitch through all; front to back pulling stitches very tight to create the look of pant legs. Attach a pompom to back for tail.

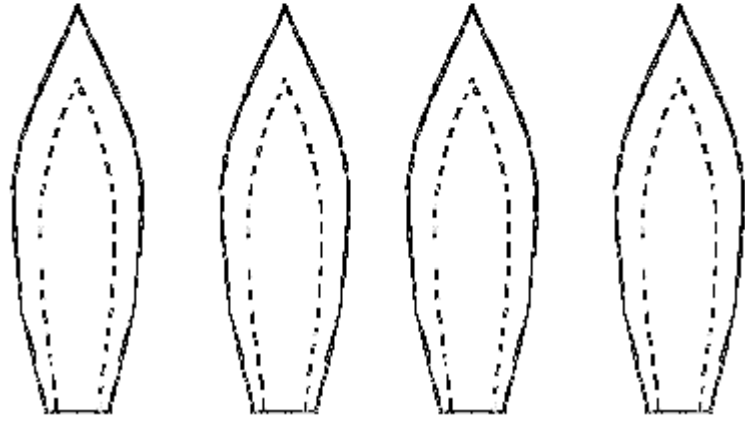
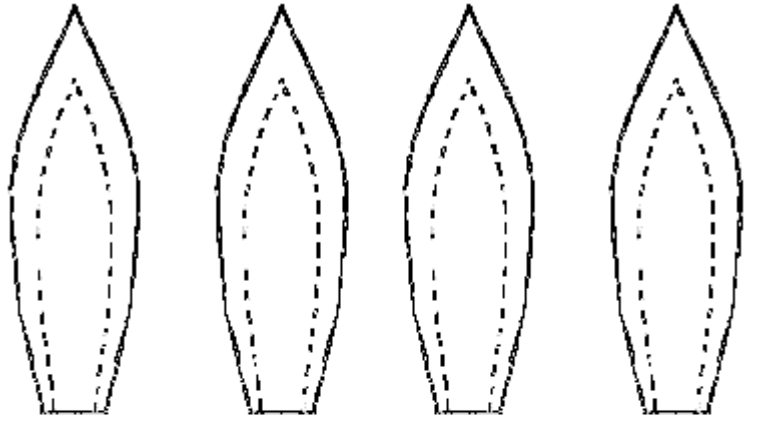

# Happy Easter

## **Directions for the Easter ears:**

Do not cut out the individual ears. Cut four pieces of white felt and two pieces of baby pink satin-like fabric measuring approximately  $2\frac{1}{4} \times 2\frac{1}{4}$  each. Lay down one of the pieces of felt, and then on top of that lay down one of the pieces of pink and on top of that lay the paper ear pattern. Now sew through all three layers on the dashed lines only! Do not tear off the paper yet! Now cut away the excess pink fabric. Lay another piece of felt on the bottom (under the trimmed pink and first piece of felt) and sew around the ear on the solid line leaving the bottom edge of the ear open. Now you can tear away the paper. Trim the outside edge of the ears to about a  $\frac{1}{8}$ <sup>th</sup> inch. At this point, if you have a small very stiff brush you can fluff the felt giving it the look of fur. Bend one of the pieces of chenille stem in half and insert the bent end into the ear. With hemostats or such spread the chenille apart so that it forms to the contour of the inside of the ear. Repeat for other ear. Trim the wire even with the bottom edge of the ears and bend about the of bottom edge at right angles and pin in the correct position on the top of the head. Glue in place a piece of ribbon around head to cover the raw edge of the ears. Tie the ribbon in a bow under her chin.



**Directions for one set of  
feet for barefoot  
Gypsy George  
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(four paper templates provided)

Cut out one of the boxes holding the pattern pieces (left). Do not cut out the individual feet pieces yet! Lay the paper on top of a double layer of dolskin with the stretch going in the crosswise direction. Sew from A to B, leaving the top and bottom open. Now cut through paper and dolskin along the bottom and top of the individual feet pieces. Carefully tear off the paper using an outward pulling motion to keep the little “chads” from getting stuck in the seam line. Cut next to the sewn lines leaving about a 1/8<sup>th</sup> inch seam allowance. Now fold the sewn pieces together matching the seams. Baste and sew rounded ends closed using a 1/4<sup>th</sup> inch seam allowance. Trim and turn. Stuff and, referring to diagram below, sculpt the toes.
