

MAKING DOLL WIGS WITH EYELASH YARN

CROCHET:

Abbreviations:

Ch - chain

Sc - single crochet

Rnd - round

Sl st - slip stitch

Materials:

Martha Stewart Glitter Eyelash Yarn

Size J/10 Crochet Hook

Bald doll head

Note: You will get better results using a larger hook. If you find the stitches hard to see - DON'T WORRY ABOUT IT! The yarn will hide any imperfections.

Ch 2

Rnd 1 - 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join rounds, carry a marker

Rnd 2 - 2 sc in each sc (12 sc)

Rnd 3 - *sc in 1st sc, 2 sc in next sc* around (18 sc)

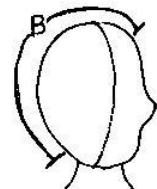
Continue increasing until your piece covers the top of your doll's head, then work 1 or 2 rnds even until you have the desired coverage. Join with a sl st and end off.

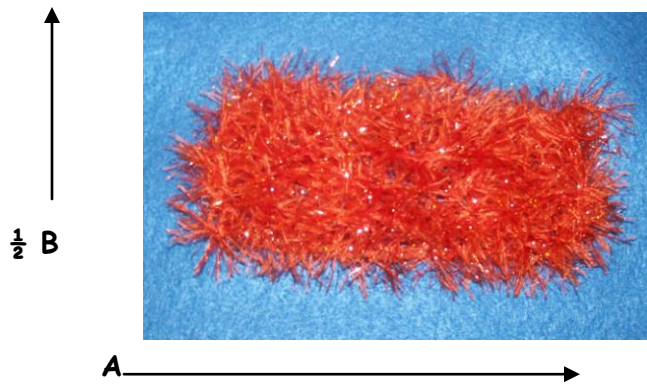
Tack down to doll's head with matching thread.

KNIT:

Knitting Needles size 8 or higher

1. Measure along the hairline all around the head, from forehead, around to nape of neck, and back to forehead. This is measurement **A**. This will be the **WIDTH** of your rectangle.
2. Measure from forehead over top of head to nape of neck. This is measurement **B**. Divide this measurement in **HALF**. It will be the **LENGTH** of your rectangle.





3. Knit a rectangle to fit your measurements using either Garter Stitch - Knit each row - or Stockinette Stitch - Knit 1 row, Purl 1 row
4. Bind off leaving a tail of yarn to sew short ends together, then gather up long edge as if you were making a cap. Tack to doll's head with matching thread.

HAIRPIN LACE LOOM:

1. Set bars desired width apart
2. Tie yarn to one bar and wrap yarn around both bars keeping the strands close together
3. For equal size loops sew down the center 2-3 times using matching thread and a small stitch.
4. For longer loops sew as close to one of the side bars as possible.
5. Remove crossbar and slide loops off the loom
6. Tack strip to doll's head using matching thread.
